TITLE 29 – WASHOE HOUSING AUTHORITY CODE

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29-10 GENERAL PROVISIONS

29-10-010 Title

This Code shall be known as the Washoe Housing Authority Code.

29-10-020 Definitions

By reference the definitions contained in Title 23, the Washoe Housing Code, shall be incorporated in this Title. In addition, the following terms, wherever used or referred to in this Title will have the following meanings, unless a different meaning clearly appears from the context:

- A. "Act" means the Native American Housing and Self Determination Act.
- B. "Area of Operation" means all area within the jurisdiction of the Washoe Tribal Council.
- C. "Authority" means the Washoe Housing Authority.
- D. "Board" means the Board of Commissioners of the Authority.
- E. "Commissioner" means a person appointed to the Board of Commissioners to manage the affairs of the Authority.
- F. "Council" means the Washoe Tribe of Nevada and California Tribal Council.
- G. "Federal Government" includes the United States of America, the Department of Housing and Urban Development, or any other agency or instrumentality, corporate or otherwise, of the United States of America.
- H. "Homebuyer" means a person(s) who has executed a lease-purchase agreement with the Authority and who has not yet achieved homeownership.
- I. "Homeowner" means a person(s) who has title to their home.

- "Housing Project" or "Project" means any work or undertaking to J. provide or assist in providing decent, safe and sanitary dwelling, apartment, or other living accommodation for Persons of Low Income (by any suitable method, including but not limited to: rental, sale of individual units in single or multi-family structures under conventional condominium or cooperative sales contract or lease-purchase agreements, loans, or subsidizing of rentals or charges). Such work or undertaking may include buildings, land leaseholds, equipment, facilities, and other real or personal property for necessary, convenient, or desirable appurtenances, for streets, sewer, water services, utilities, parks, site preparation or landscaping and for administrative, community, health, recreational, welfare, or other purposes. The term "Housing Project" or "Project" also may be applied to the planning of the buildings and improvements, the acquisition of property or any interest therein, the demolition of existing structures, the construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation, alteration or repair of the improvement or other property and all other work in connection therewith, and the term shall include all other real and personal property and all tangible or intangible assets held or used in connection with the Housing Project.
- K. "Indian Housing Plan" means the Tribal Council approved comprehensive housing plan required under the Native American Housing and Self Determination Act of 1996.
- L. "NAHASDA" means the Native American Housing and Self Determination Act, P.L. 104-330.
- M. "Obligations" means any notes, bonds, interim certifications, debentures, or other forms of obligation issued by the Authority pursuant to this Title.
- N. "Obligee" includes any holder of an obligation, agent or trustee for any holder of an obligation, or lessor demising to the Authority property used in connection with a Project, or any assignee or assignees of such lessor's interest or any part thereof, and the Federal Government when it is a party to any contract with the Authority in respect to a Housing Project.
- O. "Persons of Low Income" means persons or families who cannot afford to pay enough to cause private enterprise in their locality to build an adequate supply of decent, safe and sanitary dwellings for their use and who have family income less than 80% of the National Medium Income.
- P. "Tenant" means the lessee(s), sublessee(s), or person(s) entitled under a lease or Mutual Help Occupancy Agreement to occupy a dwelling unit, a building or land to the exclusion of others. Tenant excludes resident managers and other whose residence is conditional upon employment.

29-10-030 Creation of the Washoe Housing Authority

There is created a housing authority with the purposes and powers set forth in this Code. The name of the housing authority shall be the Washoe Housing Authority.

29-10-040 Duration

The Authority shall have perpetual succession in its own name.

29-20 OPERATIONS

29-20-010 Declaration of Need

It is hereby declared:

- A. That there exists within the area of the jurisdiction of this Council unsanitary, unsafe and overcrowded dwelling accommodations; that there is a shortage of decent, safe and sanitary dwelling accommodations available at rents or prices which Persons of Low Income can afford; and that such shortage forces such persons to occupy unsanitary, unsafe and overcrowded dwelling accommodations;
- B. That these conditions cause an increase in and spread of disease and crime and constitute a menace to health, safety, morals and welfare; and that these conditions necessitate excessive and disproportionate expenditures of public funds for crime prevention and punishment, public health and safety protection, fire and accident prevention and other public services and facilities;
- C. That this shortage of decent safe and sanitary dwellings for Persons of Low Income cannot be relieved through the operation of private enterprise;
- D. That the providing of decent, safe and sanitary dwelling accommodations for Persons of Low Income are public uses and purposes for which money may be spent and private property acquired and such actions constitute government functions of Tribal concern;
- E. That residential construction activity and a supply of acceptable housing are important factors to general economic activity, and that the undertakings authorized by this Title to aid the production of better housing and more desirable neighborhood and community development at lower costs will make possible a more stable and larger volume of residential construction and housing supply which will assist materially in achieving full employment;
- F. That Homebuyer assistance for moderate-income families has been recognized as an unmet need;

G. That these provisions are being enacted because they are necessary to serve the public interest.

29-20-020 Purpose

The Authority shall be organized and operated for the following purposes:

- A. To act as a recipient and receive block grant funds authorized under P.L. 104-330 and administer such funds in accordance with the provisions of NAHASDA, as authorized by the Washoe Tribal Council;
- B. To remedy unsafe and unsanitary housing conditions that are injurious to the public health, safety and morals;
- C. To alleviate the acute shortage of decent, safe and sanitary dwellings for Persons of Low Income;
- D. To provide employment opportunities through the construction, reconstruction, improvement, extension, alterations or repair and operation of low income dwellings;
- E. To improve the quality of life in all areas serviced by the jurisdiction of the Washoe Tribe of Nevada and California;
- F. To engage in activities that are directly or indirectly related to housing, including, but not limited to: mortgage origination and servicing; housing development and management; development and management of such housing-related services such as Laundromats, cleaning services, inspections, etc.;
- G. To participate in entities formed to accomplish any of the abovedescribed purposes including acting as a general partner of a limited partnership.

29-20-030 Board of Commissioners

- A. <u>Composition</u> The Board of Commissioners shall be composed pursuant to the following requirements:
 - (l) The affairs of the Authority shall be managed by the Board of Commissioners composed of five (5) persons.
 - (2) The Board members shall be appointed and may be reappointed by the Council. A certificate of the Secretary of the Council as to the appointment or reappointment of any Commissioner shall be conclusive evidence of the due and proper appointment of the Commissioner.

- (3) A Commissioner shall be a member of the Tribe, and may be a member or non-member of the Tribal Council. However, one Commissioner shall be from Carson Colony, one Commissioner shall be from the Dresslerville Colony, one Commissioner shall be from the Woodfords Community, one Commissioner shall be from the Stewart Community and one Commissioner shall be from the off-reservation members of the Tribe. Each Commissioner shall have an alternate representative designated to serve when the appointed member is unable to attend a meeting or function. Alternates will have no voice except when actually representing an absent Commissioner.
- (4) No person shall be barred from serving on the Board because such person is a tenant or Homebuyer in a Housing Project of the Authority; and such Commissioner shall be entitled to fully participate in all meetings concerning matters that affect all of the tenants or Homebuyers, even though such matters affect the person as well. However, no such Commissioner shall be entitled or permitted to participate in or be present at any meeting (except in the person's capacity as a tenant or Homebuyer), or to be counted or treated as a member of the Board, concerning any matter involving the Commissioner's individual right, obligation or status as a tenant or Homebuyer.
- B. <u>Term</u> After the initial appointment of Commissioners and Alternates in 2011, the Council shall appoint Commissioners and Alternates in the January Council meeting of the following years: 2015, 2019, 2023, and so on. The term of office shall be four (4) years. Each member of the Board shall hold office until a successor has been appointed and qualified.
- C. <u>Chain of Command</u> The Council shall name one of the Commissioners as Chairperson of the Board. The Board shall elect from its members a Vice-Chairperson, and a Secretary/Treasurer. In the absence of the Chairperson, the Vice-Chairperson shall preside; and in the absence of both the Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson, the Secretary/Treasurer shall preside.
- D. <u>Removal</u> A Board member's Community Council, the Board, or any Council member may recommend in writing to the Council that a Board member be removed for inefficiency or neglect of duty or for misconduct in office. The Council shall schedule a removal hearing and shall give the member written notice of the specific charges against the member at least ten (10) days prior to the hearing. At any such hearing, the member shall have the opportunity to be heard in person or through a representative. The Council may only remove a member by a two-thirds majority of the Council members present during the removal hearing.
- E. <u>Compensation</u> The Commissioners shall receive compensation for their services as established from time to time by the Board and approved by

the Tribal Council and shall be entitled to compensation for expenses, including travel expenses, incurred in the discharge of their duties pursuant to applicable Tribal policies.

- F. <u>Voting and Quorum</u> Three (3) members (a majority of the five (5) member Board) shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. No Board action shall be taken by a vote of less than three (3) members. The existence of vacancies at any time shall not effect the three (3) member voting requirement.
- G. <u>Recordkeeping</u> The Secretary or designee shall keep complete and accurate records of all meetings and actions taken by the Board.
- H. <u>Financial Reporting</u> The Treasurer shall keep full and accurate financial records, make periodic reports to the Board, and submit a complete annual report, in written form, to the Tribal Council as required by Section 29-40-010 of this Title. Financial records will be in a form acceptable to the Tribal Chief Financial Officer.
- I. <u>Meetings</u> Meetings of the Board shall be held at regular intervals as provided in the By-Laws. Emergency meetings may be held with at least 24-hours' notice, but the Chairperson has the duty to give as much notice as possible.
 - (1) Telephonic meetings shall be allowed under the following conditions:
 - (a) All members participating can be heard and can participate in the discussion.
 - (b) Notice is given in the same manner as for a regular meeting.
 - (c) A quorum of members participates in the telephone meeting.

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29-20-040 Powers of the Authority

The Authority shall have the following powers, which it may exercise consistent with the purposes for which it is established:

- A. To adopt and use a seal.
- B. To enter into agreements, contracts and understandings with any Tribal, Federal, State or local governmental agency, or with any person, partnership, corporation or Indian tribe; and to agree to any conditions attached to Federal financial assistance, consistent with the approved Indian Housing Plan.

- C. To agree, notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this Title or in any other provision of Tribal law, to any conditions attached to Federal financial assistance relating to the determination of prevailing salaries or wages or payment of not less than prevailing salaries or wages or compliance with labor standards, in the development or operation of Projects; and the Authority may include in any contract in connection with a Project stipulations requiring that the contractor and any subcontractors comply with requirements as to minimum salaries or wages and maximum hours of work, and to comply with any conditions which the Federal Government may have attached to its financial aid for the Project.
- D. To lease property from the Tribe and others for such periods as are authorized by law, and to hold and manage or to sublease the same.
- E. To borrow or lend money, to issue temporary or long term evidence of indebtedness, and to repay the same. Obligations shall be issued and repaid in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 29-30 of this Title.
- F. To pledge the assets and receipts of the Authority as security for debts; and to acquire, sell, lease, exchange, transfer or assign personal property or interests therein.
- G. To purchase land or interest in land or take the same by gift; to lease land or interests in land to the extent provided by law and consistent with the approved Indian Housing Plan.
- H. To undertake and carry out studies and analysis of housing needs, to prepare housing plans, to execute the same, to operate Projects and to provide for the construction, reconstruction, improvement, extension, alteration or repair of any Project or part thereof.
- I. With respect to any dwelling, accommodations, lands, or buildings or facilities contained within any Project (including individual cooperative or condominium units); to lease or rent, sell, enter into lease purchase agreements or leases with option to purchase; to establish and revise rents or required monthly payments; to make rules and regulations concerning the selection of tenants or Homebuyers, including the establishment of priorities, and concerning the occupancy, rental, care and management of housing units; and to make such further rules and regulations as the Board may deem necessary and desirable to effectuate the powers granted by this Title in accordance with NAHASDA, P.L. 104-330.
- J. To finance purchase of a home by an eligible Homebuyer in accordance with regulations and requirements of the Indian Housing Plan.
- K. To terminate any lease, rental agreement, or lease-purchase agreement when the tenant or Homebuyer violated the terms of such agreement, or

failed to meet any of the agreement's requirements, or when such termination is otherwise authorized under the provisions of such agreement; and to bring action for eviction against such tenant or Homebuyer.

- L. To establish income limits for admission that ensure that dwelling accommodations in a Housing Project shall be made available only to eligible participants as defined by the approved Washoe Tribe's Indian Housing Plan.
- M. To purchase insurance from any stock or mutual company for any property or against any risk or hazards or to participate in a plan of self insurance authorized by the HUD Secretary such as Amerind Risk Management.
- N. To invest such funds as are not required for immediate disbursement.
- O. To establish and maintain such bank accounts as may be necessary or convenient.
- P. To employ an Executive Director, technical and maintenance personnel and such other officers and employees, permanent or temporary, as the Authority may require and to delegate to such officers and employees such powers or duties as the Board shall deem proper.
- Q. To take such further actions as are commonly engaged in by public bodies of this character, consistent with the approved Washoe Tribe's Indian Housing Plan.
- R. To join or cooperate with any other public housing agency or agencies operating under the laws or ordinances of the State or another tribe in the exercise, either jointly or otherwise, of any or all of the powers of the Authority and such other public housing agency or agencies for the purpose of financing (including but not limited to the issuance of notes or other Obligations and giving security therefore), planning, undertaking, owning, constructing, operating or contracting with respect to a Housing Project or Projects of the Authority or such other public housing agency or agencies. For such purpose, the Authority may by resolution prescribe and authorize any other public housing agency or agencies, so joining or cooperating with the Authority, to act on the Authority's behalf with respect to any or all powers, as the Authority's agent or otherwise, in the name of the Authority or in the name of such agency or agencies.
- S. To adopt such authority rules, as the Board deems necessary and appropriate pursuant to the Law and Order Code of the Washoe Tribe of Nevada and California.

29-30 OBLIGATIONS

29-30-010 General Provisions

The Authority may issue Obligations from time to time in its discretion for any of its purposes and may also issue refunding Obligations for the purpose of paying or retiring Obligations previously issued by it. The Authority may issue such types of Obligations as it may determine, including Obligations on which the principal and interest are payable either; (a) exclusively from the income and revenues of the Project financed with the proceeds of such obligation, or with such income and revenues together with a grant from the Federal Government in aid of such Project; (b) exclusively from the income and revenues of certain designated Projects whether or not they were financed in whole or in part with the proceeds of such Obligations; or (c) from its revenues generally. Any such Obligations may be additionally secured by a pledge of any revenues of any Project or other property of the Authority.

29-30-020 No Personal Liability for Obligations

Neither the Commissioners of the Authority nor any person executing the Obligations shall be liable personally on the Obligations by reason of issuance thereof.

29-30-030 No Liability by the Washoe Tribe for the Obligations of the Authority

The notes and other Obligations of the Authority, including judgments, shall not be a debt of the Washoe Tribe and the Obligations shall so state on their face.

29-30-040 Rules for Issuance of Obligations

Obligations shall be issued in the following manner:

- A. Obligations of the Authority shall be authorized by a resolution adopted by the vote of a majority of the full Board and may be issued in one or more series.
- B. The Obligations shall bear such dates, mature at such times, bear interest at such rates, be in such denominations, be in such form, either coupon or registered, carry such conversion or registration privileges, have such rank or priority, be executed in such a manner, be payable in such medium of payment and at such places, and be subject to such terms of redemption, with or without premium, as such resolution may provide.
- C. The Obligations may be sold at public or private sale at not less than par.
- D. In case any of the Commissioners of the Authority whose signatures appear on any Obligations cease to be Commissioners before the delivery of such Obligations, the signatures shall, nevertheless, be valid and

sufficient for all purposes, the same as if the Commissioners had remained in office until delivery.

29-30-050 Negotiability of Obligations

Obligations of the Authority shall be fully negotiable. In any suit, action or proceeding involving the validity or enforceability or any Obligations of the Authority or the security therefore, any such obligation reciting in substance that it bas been issued by the Authority to aid in financing a Project pursuant to this Title shall be conclusively deemed to have been issued for such purpose, and the Project for which such obligation was issued shall be conclusively deemed to have been planned, located and carried out in accordance with the purposes and provisions of this Title.

29-30-060 Powers of the Authority Concerning Obligations

In connection with the issuance of Obligations, or incurring of Obligations under leases and to secure the payment of such Obligations, the Authority, subject to the limitations in the Title, may:

- A. Pledge all or part of its gross or net rents, fees, or revenues to which its right then exists or may thereafter come into existence.
- B. Provide for the powers and duties of Obligees and limit their liabilities; and provide the terms and conditions on which such Obligees may enforce any covenant or rights securing or relating to the Obligations.
- C. Covenant against pledging all or any part of its rents, fees and revenues or against mortgaging any or all of its real or personal property to which its title or right then exists or may thereafter come into existence or permitting or suffering any lien on such revenues or property.
- D. Covenant with respect to limitations on its right to sell, lease or otherwise dispose of any Project or any part thereof.
- E. Covenant as to what other or additional debts or Obligations may be incurred by it.
- F. Covenant as to the Obligations to be issued and as to the issuance of such Obligations in escrow or otherwise, and as to the use and disposition of the proceeds thereof.
- G. Provide for the replacement of lost, destroyed or mutilated Obligations.
- H. Covenant against extending the time for the payment of its Obligations or interest thereon.
- I. Redeem the Obligations and covenant for their redemption and provide the terms and conditions thereof.

- J. Covenant concerning the rents and fees to be charged in the operation of a Project or Projects, the amount to be raised each year or other period of time by rents, fees, and other revenues, and as to the use and disposition to be made thereof.
- K. Create or authorize the creation of special funds for monies held for construction or operation costs, debt services, reserves and other purposes, and covenants as to the use and disposition of the monies held in such funds.
- L. Prescribe the procedure, if any, by which the terms of any contract with holders of Obligations may be amended or abrogated, the proportion of outstanding Obligations of the holders of which must consent thereto, and the manner in which such consent may be given.
- M. Covenant as to the use, maintenance and replacement of its real or personal property, the insurance to be carried thereon and the use and disposition of the insurance monies.
- N. Covenant as to the rights, liabilities, powers and duties arising upon the breach by it of any covenant, condition or obligation.
- O. Covenant and prescribe as to the events of default and terms and conditions upon which any or all of its Obligations become or may be declared due before maturity, and as to the terms and conditions upon which such declarations and its consequences may be waived.
- P. Vest in any Obligees or any proportion of them the right to enforce the payment of the Obligations or any covenant securing or relating to the Obligations.
- Q. Exercise all or any part or combination of the powers granted in this Section.
- R. Make covenants other than and in addition to the covenants expressly authorized in this Section, of like or different character.
- S. Make any covenants, any acts and anything necessary or convenient or desirable in order to secure its Obligations, or in the absolute discretion of the Authority, take an action tending to make the Obligations more marketable, although the covenants, acts or thing making the Obligations more marketable are not enumerated in this Section.

29-40 RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE AUTHORITY

29-40-010 Annual Report

The Authority shall prepare an annual report for the Tribal Council consistent with Section 403 and 404 of NAHASDA and make those reports public. The authority win also make all records available to the Tribal Secretary and Tribal Chief Financial Officer for an annual audit that will then become part of the annual compliance report as required under Section 405 of NAHASDA.

29-40-020 Compliance with Contract, Tribal, and Federal Requirements

Each Project developed or operated under a contract providing for Federal financial assistance shall be developed and operated in compliance with all requirements of such contract and applicable Tribal and Federal legislation and with all regulations and requirements prescribed from time to time by the Tribal and Federal Government in connection with such assistance.

29-40-030 Fidelity Bond Coverage

The Authority shall obtain or facilitate obtaining adequate fidelity bond coverage of its officers, agents, or employees handling cash or authorized to sign checks or certify vouchers.

29-40-040 Procurement Policy

In conducting its business, the Authority shall adopt and follow a procurement policy that shall be in compliance with any applicable Tribal Laws.

29-50 PROHIBITIONS

29-50-010 Financial Interest in Projects Prohibited for Certain Individuals

During tenure, and for one year thereafter, no Commissioner, officer or employee of the Authority, or any member of any governing body of the Tribe, or any other public official who exercises any responsibilities or functions with regard to the Project, shall voluntarily acquire any financial interest, direct or indirect, in any Project or in any property included or planned to be included in any Project, or in any contract or proposed contract relating to any Project, unless prior to such acquisition, the person discloses the interest in writing to the Authority and such disclosure is entered upon the minutes of the Authority, and the Commissioner, officer, or employee shall not participate in any action by the Authority relating to the property or contract in which the person has such interest. If any Commissioner, officer or employee of the Authority involuntarily acquires any such financial interest, or voluntarily or involuntarily acquired any such financial interest prior to appointment or employment as a Commissioner, officer or employee, the Commissioner, officer or employee, in any such event, shall immediately disclose the financial interest in writing to the Authority, and such disclosure shall be entered upon the minutes of the Authority and the Commissioner, officer or employee shall not participate in any action by the Page 13 of 15

Page 13 of 15 Current Through 5/24/11 Authority relating to the property or contract in which the person has any such financial interest.

29-50-020 Misconduct in Office

Any violation of the prohibitions contained in this Title shall constitute misconduct in office. This Section shall not be applicable to the acquisition of any interest in Obligations of the Authority issued in connection with any Project, or to the execution of agreements by banking institutions for the deposit or handling of funds in connection with a Project or to act as trustee under any trust indenture, or to utility services the rates for which are fixed or controlled by a governmental agency, or to membership on the Board as provided in Section 29-20-020(A)(4).

29-60 PROPERTY OF THE AUTHORITY

29-60-010 Public Property

The property of the Authority is declared to be public property used for essential public and governmental purposes and such property and the Authority are exempt from all taxes and special assessments as cited in NAHASDA, Sec. 101(D), P.L. 104-330.

29-60-020 Exemption from Levy and Sale by an Execution

All property including funds acquired or held by the Authority pursuant to this Title shall be exempt from levy and sale by virtue of an execution, and no execution or other judicial process shall issue against the same nor shall any judgment against the Authority be a charge or lien upon such property. However, the provisions of this Section shall not apply to or limit the right of Obligees to pursue any remedies for the enforcement of any pledge or lien given by the Authority on its rents, fees or revenues or the right of the Federal Government to pursue any remedies conferred upon it pursuant to the provisions of this Title of the right of the Authority to bring eviction actions in accordance with the provisions of this Title.

29-70 COOPERATION BETWEEN THE AUTHORITY AND THE WASHOE TRIBE

29-70-010 Agreement to Cooperate by the Washoe Tribe

For the purpose of aiding and cooperating in the planning, undertaking, construction or operation of Projects, the Washoe Tribal Council shall agree to the following:

- A. It will not levy or impose any real or personal property taxes or special assessments upon the Authority or any Project of the Authority.
- B. It will furnish or cause to be furnished to the Authority and the occupants of Projects all services and facilities of the same character and to the same

extent as the Tribe furnishes from time to time without cost or charge to other dwellings and inhabitants.

- C. Insofar as it may lawfully do so. it may grant such deviations from any present or future building or housing codes of the Tribe as are reasonable and necessary to promote economy and efficiency in the development and operation of any Project, and at the same time safeguard health and safety, and make such changes in any zoning of the site and surrounding territory of any Project as are reasonable and necessary for the development and protection of such Project, and the surrounding territory.
- D. It will do any and all things, within its lawful power, necessary or convenient to aid and cooperate in the planning, undertaking, construction, or operation of Projects.
- E. That the power of the Tribal Council shall be vigorously utilized to enforce eviction of a tenant or Homebuyer for nonpayment or other contract violations including action through the appropriate courts.

29-70-020 Jurisdiction of the Washoe Tribal Court

The Washoe Tribal Court shall have jurisdiction to hear and determine an action of eviction of a tenant or Homebuyer. The Washoe Tribal Council hereby declares that the powers of the Tribal Courts shall be vigorously utilized to enforce eviction of a tenant or Homebuyer for nonpayment or other contract violations.
